CASA DEL PASTOR is a home in Baja California, Mexico for women and their children who are abandoned and abused. Its goal is to minister to their spiritual needs while helping with their physical needs.

The women housed at Casa del Pastor are provided a safe place to live and raise their children while receiving training in skills like sewing and cooking to help them support their families. Life skills like managing finances and managing a house are also part of the training they receive. Bible studies are also part of their daily routine.

OUR ONGOING MISSION includes bringing clothing and construction supplies. Our teams continue the facilities upgrades and maintenance by painting and installing insulation in the living quarters and work rooms. We also provide clothing, medical relief and supplies when possible.

### **SAFTEY**

Do not drink the water in any third world country. Use bottled or filtered water only. However, it is safe to shower as long as you are cautious about drinking the water so please do not skip showering. Bottled water will be provided for drinking and brushing your teeth. Flip-flops for showering are recommended.

It is important to remember that Mexico is a different country and not always safe for Americans. Never travel alone and notify your mission leader when leaving designated areas.

### MISSION REQUIREMENTS

CC Perris Valley requires each potential mission volunteer to complete a number of steps prior to participating in any mission. Be sure to check your email regularly for updates.

Please visit ccperrisvalley.org/docs to complete your paperwork. \*Please note that deposits are not accepted without required paperwork being completed.

- Short Term Application (required of not completed previously in 2017)
- Medical Information and Release (required once annually or if information has changed)
- Photograph and Video Release (required if not completed previously in 2017)
- Short Term Liability Waiver (separate waiver required for each mission)
- One color copy of passport (good quality phone photo can be emailed to missions@ccperrisvalley.org)

#### OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Passport Book; Apply no later than 7 weeks prior to departure.
- Tetanus shot must be current (within the last 7 years.)
- Participate in fund raising events if applicable.

## **BEING PREPARED**

Understand that missions work can be dirty work so bring used, but clean, clothes that you don't mind being damaged. Do not purchase new things unless necessary for the environment. If you will be doing construction or relief work bring gloves, safety glasses and closed toed boots/shoes.

When packing ask yourself if what you are packing is glorifying to God or glorifying to you. Makeup, logos, extreme fashion, flashy, excessive or expensive jewelry are strongly discouraged. Wedding rings, if expensive, may encourage theft in third world countries as well as be discouraging to those who you are trying to minister to. Consider your safety and God's glory as you prepare for this trip.

Weather is similar to coastal California, it is warm but can get cool coastal breezes. Please wear clean, undamaged clothing (no holy jeans or armpits) that can be layered for warmth. No sleeveless shirts, tank tops or muscle tees. Shorts and skirts should be just above the knee and loose fitting. Both men and women should avoid "skinny" jeans that are form fitting. Do not bring leggings/yoga pants, unless worn only in the bedroom/dorm room for sleeping or worn with an outfit that would be considered appropriate without the them.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Fighting, harassment, continued coarse speech or behavior will not be tolerated. We do not allow possession of any weapon or dangerous object. Possession or use of tobacco, vaporizers, alcohol, or controlled substances is also not permissible.

Men are not allowed in women's rooms and women are not allowed in men's rooms at any time.

Each time you use a space make every effort to leave it in better condition than when you arrived. Please keep common areas and areas of ministry tidy. Pick up trash, return furniture to its original location if moved and keep personal items in your bedroom or dorm area when not in use. Be respectful and do not leave a mess for others to clean up.

Please turn off lights, fans and air conditioners in each room when leaving your living and common areas. Close windows and lock doors when leaving any facility.

Bathrooms and bedrooms should be clean at all times. Tidy bathroom and make beds daily and keep personal items, cloths, towels, etc., organized and within your own space.

Kitchens and communal space should also be cleaned up after each use. Do not leave dirty dishes in the sink. Immediately wash them or place them in a dish washer if one is available. Put all food away in the refrigerator or pantry/shelves neatly. Keep the dining area free from food, dishes and other items when not in use.
